The mission of the Club is to identify and study native plants and their habitats and to advocate the protection of biodiversity in our natural world. Club activities include:

- Weekly field trips (twice-weekly in April and May)
- Informative indoor winter programs
- Workshops
- Community service projects
- Maintenance of a database of Southern Appalachian biota

The Club encourages a botanical & ecological approach to the study of the plants of the Southern Appalachians. All levels of expertise, including beginners, are welcome.

Dues are \$15 per year per household with renewals on January first of each year. For new members joining during the period July 1 – December 31, dues are \$8 with renewal the following January first.
